The PTO and PTSA are completely separate, both providing opportunities for NBMS students to thrive.

NOTE TO ALL PARENTS: Please note there are no organized Ski Club trips on January 17th (MLK Weekend), February 7th (SGA Dance), February 14th (President's Day Weekend), or February 28th (Early Release Day). Your Night Club Card is valid still on those nights; NBMS Ski Club is not, however, providing organized bus transportation. The Make-Up Day will occur only if one of the regularly scheduled trips is cancelled due to NBMS being closed or closing early that day.

NOTE TO 6th GRADE PARENTS: The January 10th ski club trip is the same day as Outdoor Ed for last names M-Z. Those 6th grade students will be returning to NBMS around 1pm on Friday to be picked-up by their parents. We load buses starting at 2:40pm, and depart at 3pm. Neither the PTO nor the school have plans for student supervision between 1pm-2:40pm, so please take that into account in your family's schedule. If your student wishes to participate in the Ski Club trip that evening, we suggest taking your student home to eat and refresh, and then return at 2:40pm for ski club. You may still drop off equipment in the morning at the POD if you wish.

2014 Ski Club Registration Instructions

**** IMPORANT – PLEASE READ – ALL NEW REGISTRATION PROCEDURES ****

Registering For Ski Club

To secure a seat on a bus to/from NBMS/Liberty Mountain, **you must do these five things:**

- 1) **Pre-register online for NBMS Ski Club at <http://www.nbms-pto.org> between October 7th and October 17th.** Doing so will allow you to enter casually all information needed prior to registration night. Please note that pre-registering does not save you a space in Ski Club. You must still register for a spot and pay on October 17th.

NBMS PTO is using ASAP Connect for Ski Club, the same site used by NBMS PTSA for After School Activities. However, the two are not connected in any way. Even if you have an account for PTSA's After School Activities, you must set-up a new account for Ski Club.

- 2) **Register online for NBMS Ski Club, and pay \$115, at <http://www.nbms-pto.org> on Thursday, October 17, 2013 @ 7pm sharp.** If you pre-registered, this will take just a few minutes. Seats are limited and will likely sell out. ***Don't be late, or you risk missing out!*** Please note that this fee is non-refundable. (No computer? You may visit the NBMS Media Center @ 6:30pm on October 17th to pre-register, and then register starting @ 7pm).

Please note that we are not taking any paper registrations this year. All must be done online. This saves you time and makes it easier for the PTO volunteers to manage Ski Club.

After registering and paying online, you will be sent a confirmation e-mail. If space is not available, you will be able to sign-up for the waitlist.

- 3) **Sign and turn in the NBMS PTO Ski Club Participant's Permission Form and Waiver Agreement** (available online and pages 9 & 10). Both the student and parent must sign!

*****The student must turn in this signed agreement to the NBMS Office by Friday, October 25th, or risk losing his/her space in Ski Club.*****

- 4) **Buy online an NBMS Night Club Card, and pay \$179 (lift ticket only), \$224 (lift/lesson), or \$264 (lift/lesson/rental), at <http://www.skiliberty.com> after you have registered for and received an e-mail receipt for NBMS Ski Club.** We highly recommend that you do this on October 17, but if not, you must purchase the card by midnight on Thursday, October 24th. While purchasing the Night Club Card online, you may also purchase a reasonably-priced black helmet (\$50), Advantage Card (\$20), and/or Protection Policy (\$8) – all are optional.

- 5) **Print out, sign, and turn in a Ski Liberty Night Club Card Release Agreement,** available at the time you purchase (by PDF download). Both the student and parent must sign!

*****The student must turn in this second signed agreement to the NBMS Office by Friday, October 25th, or risk losing his/her space in Ski Club.*****

2014 Ski Club Procedural Information

**** IMPORANT – PLEASE READ – UPDATED SKI CLUB PROCEDURES ****

Before The Ski Season

- **Registering For Ski Club:** All participants must register and pay for a spot in the NBMS Ski Club following the instructions on the previous page. Only registered participants and approved Chaperones will be allowed to ride the bus on Ski Club trips.

The participant must register online starting Thursday, October 17th @ 7pm, and the NBMS PTO Ski Club Participant's Permission Form and Waiver Agreement must be received at the NBMS Office by October 25th, for you to join Ski Club.

- **Bus Buddy Requests:** In an effort to make the entire Ski Club experience as enjoyable as possible, we offer every participant the opportunity to choose up to three (3) friends to ride with on the same bus. (Buses are organized as such: 8th grade, 7th/8th grade, 7th grade, 6th/7th grade, and 6th grade). Please note that every effort will be made to accommodate requests, but we cannot guarantee placement. **NEW THIS YEAR: We can only accommodate groups of two, three, or four. Please make sure that each person in the group lists the same people to ensure proper placement on the buses.**

Bus assignments will be posted at NBMS in mid-December.

- **Night Club Card:** All participants must purchase a Night Club Card online through the NBMS PTO Ski Club. This card is required during Ski Club trips to Liberty Mountain. It is also good for a participant's lift tickets, lessons, and/or equipment rentals (depending on which one you purchase) on any night from January 2, 2014 through the last day of the 2014 season, at Liberty (Carroll Valley, PA), Roundtop (Lewisberry, PA), and Whitetail (Mercersburg, PA). Discounted helmets (you must wear one), Advantage Cards (additional discounts), and a fee protection plan are also available for purchase.

The card must be purchased online by Thursday, October 24th, and the Ski Liberty Night Club Card Release Agreement must be received at the NBMS Office by the 25th, for you to join Ski Club. Cards will be available for pick up at NBMS in mid-December.

- **HELMETS ARE MANDATORY:** All participants (including Chaperones) must wear a snow sports helmet while on the slopes. Note that it must be for snow sports, not for bicycling, skateboarding, or other sports activity. **You will not be permitted on the bus departing NBMS for Liberty without a helmet in your possession!** Any Ski Club member observed on the slopes without a helmet will lose their lift ticket for the night. Repeat offenders will be expelled from Ski Club without refund. If a helmet is lost, the participant must then rent one at Liberty for the evening. No helmet? No slopes!

Helmets are available for purchase online from Liberty for \$50 when buying your Night Club Card. These helmets will be available for pick-up at NBMS in mid-December.

- **Beginner Skiers/Boarders:** Never skied or boarded before? Or just barely know how to ski/board? All beginner skiers/boarders (noted as “Type I” on the Night Club Card online application) must select the Lesson option. Skiing or boarding when you don’t know what you’re doing isn’t fun, and is unsafe. Everyone in Ski Club at one point in their life was a beginner, just like you, and had to take lessons. Want to be like them? Learn!

Before Each Trip

- **Safety & Decision-Making Discussion:** Parents and students should **together** read, discuss, and agree to the information contained within this Information Packet, as well as the MCPS policies for student behavior, NBMS Ski Club Behavioral Expectations, and the Liberty Mountain Code of Conduct and Responsibility Code. In addition, we encourage all parents and students to have this discussion every week:

Ten Decisions Made Every Week by NBMS Ski Club Participants

1. Do I rent skis or a snowboard tonight?
 2. Do I take lessons tonight? If yes, at what time?
 3. What lifts and runs will I try tonight?
 4. Will I use the terrain park tonight?
 5. With whom will I ski/board, and what is their ability compared to mine?
 6. If my friends want to ski/board on a run that I’m not familiar, what will I do?
 7. If I get separated from my friends while on the mountain, what will I do?
 8. Will I ski in control or unsafely?
 9. Will I drink high-caffeine energy drinks?
 10. How will I behave on the bus, in the lodge, and on the mountain?
- **Cancelled Trips:** If NBMS is closed or closes early on the day of a Ski Club trip, that trip is cancelled. In addition, Ski Club coordinators may decide to cancel any scheduled trip due to weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances. Notices regarding cancellation will be posted three places:
 - On the NBMS PTO Website (www.nbms-ptd.org)
 - Via e-mail on the NBMS PTSA Information Listserv (to subscribe, parents should send an e-mail to northbethesdamsptsa-subscribe@yahogroups.com)
 - Via e-mail to all e-mail addresses you provide during registration

- **Ski Gear and Bag POD Storage:** A storage pod is available in the school's lower parking lot during morning drop-off from 7:15 AM to 8:00 AM on ski trip days. Upon arrival, you may bring up to one bag, one ski/snowboard equipment, and/or one pair of boots to the storage area. No loose items are allowed – they must be packed in a bag for storage. Do not take anything into the school that will not fit in your locker. The storage pod will be locked during the school day. **NEW THIS YEAR: All items must be tagged with the participant's name, home or cell phone number, and a Ski Club provided bus number/color tag.** All items will be removed from the pod and placed in bus-specific piles by Chaperones before students are dismissed at 2:40 PM. Participants will be responsible for moving their gear onto the bus before boarding. Any leftover items will be placed in the pod, and accessible again during the next trip. Unfortunately, we can't open it any other time. **The PTO and NBMS is not responsible for lost or stolen items.**

- **Bus Transportation:** Chartered Ski Club buses depart NBMS by 3:00 PM and return to NBMS at *approximately* 11:15 PM. Buses are scheduled to leave Liberty at 10:00 PM, but we sometimes leave earlier. For departure from Liberty, **participants must return to the buses by 9:40 PM** so that equipment can be stowed and attendance taken. **Parents must arrive at NBMS by 11:10 PM for pick-up.** Please do not be late.

- **Not Riding Bus Back Home:** If a participant is not going to ride the bus back to NBMS from Liberty, he or she must give the bus chaperone a dated note signed by the participant's parent while on the bus ride up to Liberty. Otherwise, the participant must return to NBMS on the bus. No exceptions!

- **What To Wear:** Bring clothing appropriate for skiing/boarding. Check the night before for the predicted temperature and precipitation (rain? snow?) for 5pm to 9pm in Carroll Valley, PA. A snow sport helmet, layered clothing, water-resistant pants, water-resistant coat, water-resistant gloves/mittens, socks, and snow sport goggles are recommended for all skiers and boarders. Additional information on Liberty website.

- **Backpacks & Instruments:** You will have to bring all of your belongings on the bus with you, including your school backpack and instrument. There will be no access to the school or the storage pod on Friday night when we return. You can stow items in the bus cargo hold. Locker rentals are also available at Liberty. **Valuables should not be left in the passenger area of the bus!** Lock them up or carry them with you, as neither the PTO nor the bus company is responsible for lost or stolen items.

- **Movies on the Bus:** DVD movies will be shown during the bus rides to and from Liberty Mountain. Chaperones usually provide them, but if a participant wants to bring a DVD to share, please remember that only G-rated and PG-rated movies will be shown. No PG-13, R, or unrated movies. The PTO is not responsible for lost or broken DVDs.

- **Food & Drinks:** You are encouraged to pack and carry your own snacks, or even a meal, for eating while at Liberty. **All participants should have some type of after-school snack or meal packed for eating on the bus between 3 - 4:30 PM.** Skiing is an athletic activity and being well nourished and hydrated before and during skiing is important!

- **Money:** Bring sufficient money for food, drinks, and incidental expenses at Liberty. We recommend at least \$15 to \$20 per night, depending on your needs. Locker rentals range from \$3 to \$8, depending on size (many students share the larger lockers) and require exact change. Dinner prices range from \$7 to \$15, depending on selection. Chaperones are not able to loan money. You may load money on your Night Club Card.

On Each Trip

- **Chaperones:** Both adult and high school aged chaperones will be at NBMS for bus loading, on the buses, at the lift ticket line, in the rental areas, and at the bottom of the slopes to provide direction. You will also find them in the lodge and on the slopes throughout the evening if you need help or have a question. Look for the blue NBMS Ski Club jackets, and don't be afraid to ask for help. We are here for you. **Chaperones, however, are not supervising participants while skiing or boarding at Liberty Mountain.** With 100 acres of skiable terrain, participants are "on their own" while skiing and boarding at Liberty. Ski Patrol and lift operators are trained professionals who assist skiers and boarders as needed. Participants are expected to follow all Liberty Mountain rules and codes of conduct while on property.
- **Lift Tickets:** Upon arrival at Liberty Mountain, chaperones will direct participants and provide assistance in the both the lift ticket lines and rental areas. **You must have your Night Club Card in your possession to receive a lift ticket and to get rental equipment.** If you lost or misplaced your Night Club Card, alert your bus's lead chaperone when you get on the bus. Liberty will provide a one-time ticket at the Group Sales Office if you forget your card. Lost cards or second time forgetting requires you pay \$25 to get a new card at the Group Sales Office. Don't forget or lose it – the delay is up to 30 minutes.
- **Rentals:** All Ski Club participants who do not purchase the rental option on their Night Club Card must bring along equipment. **No out-of-pocket rentals will be permitted.**
- **Lessons:** Whether you are new to skiing/boarding or have been enjoying it for years, Liberty's skilled instructors make your time on the snow the best it can be. Small group lessons are available every night at 4:30pm (we arrive too late), 5:45pm (most common choice), and 7:00pm. Each lesson is one hour in length and includes several runs. Best of all, you go to the front of the lift line when you're with a ski instructor! Additional information available on Liberty website.

Friends not taking lessons, or encourage you to skip it? Hard to do the opposite, but we know you will be making the right choice by taking lessons at Liberty! **NEW THIS YEAR – all lesson takers will have their lift ticket punched by the instructor. Everyone who takes lessons will be eligible to win prizes on the bus ride back to NBMS!**

- **Skiing Alone – Don't Do It:** No one should ever ski or snow board alone. Please make sure you meet up with a friend on the slopes, or join an existing group of skiers or boarders at your ability level. This is a club, and no one should be excluded from joining in with others. If you find yourself without a "ski buddy," please ask a chaperone for assistance in locating a group. Best place to find similar skilled participants? Lessons!

About Family Members Participating in Ski Club

- Any family member of a participating NBMS student may purchase a Night Club Card at the NBMS Ski Club price. To do so, follow just instructions #4 and #5 under Registration.
- We will not have any extra seats on the buses for parents or non-NBMS students. Only registered Ski Club members and approved Chaperones ride the buses.
- A parent driving a minor – NBMS student or not – on Ski Club trip nights is solely and legally responsible for the supervision, safety, and welfare of the child for the entirety of the trip. NBMS PTO assumes no responsibility for those not registered as Ski Club members, even if they purchase a Night Club Card at the NBMS Ski Club price, and/or visit Ski Liberty on the same night and times as the NBMS Ski Club.

A Word About Safety – READ THIS WITH YOUR STUDENT!

- The NBMS PTO, Ski Club, volunteer Chaperones, bus drivers, and Liberty Mountain staff all take skier and boarder safety very seriously.
- **We need parents and students to take safety very seriously as well.**
- Each year, an NBMS student gets hurt while participating in Ski Club. Sometimes it's minor. Sometimes it's very serious. In almost every case, the student wasn't being safe. In all cases, it is the student's sole responsibility to act in a safe manner at all times.
- That's why we emphasize with great passion the behavioral expectations, code of conduct, and responsibility code. **But we can only do so much – we need parents to emphasize these things with their children, AND THE STUDENTS TO BE SMART!**
- **Chaperones are not supervising your children while they ski/board.** With more than 100 acres of terrain, the chaperones cannot be more than a resource for Ski Club members. Ski Patrol and Lift Operators are "in charge" on the mountain.
- We highly encourage you to go through the Ten Questions on page 4 **before every trip.** Help your child make the right decisions before they head to the mountain. They will thank you for it when they return home in great shape. And so will the Chaperones!
- Please also read and review the NBMS Ski Club Behavioral Expectations, Liberty Mountain Code of Conduct, and Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code on the next page.
- **Should a participant become injured or sick while on an NBMS Ski Club trip, every effort will be made by the NBMS PTO, volunteer Chaperones, and Liberty Mountain personnel to seek appropriate medical treatment and/or hospitalization. Parents and/or designated emergency contacts will be called, as time permits, should such actions be necessary. Parents may be required to drive up to Liberty Mountain or a medical center/hospital to provide transportation home to their child.**

NBMS Ski Club Behavioral Expectations

All Ski Club members are expected to adhere to all MCPS and Liberty Mountain rules and codes, and always be safe, cooperative and respectful. Always!

These behaviors are **absolutely unacceptable**, and are cause for loss of Ski Club membership:

- Threatening, abusive, obscene, or violent language, gestures, or behavior.
- Throwing of **anything** on the bus or out of a bus window.
- Refusal to sit properly and remain seated on the bus, or refusal to use safety belt (if there is a safety belt in a seat, it must be used).
- Vandalism, graffiti, or defacement of the bus in any way.
- Any inappropriate use of the on-board bus bathroom.
- Interfering with the bus driver or the safe operation of the bus.
- Drug, alcohol, or tobacco use.
- Sexual activity of any kind.
- Refusal to cooperate with a chaperone's direct request.
- Violation of the Liberty Mountain Code of Conduct or Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code.
- Leaving the immediate vicinity of the lodge and slopes. *Shuttle buses and the tubing area "Boulder Ridge" are strictly off limits.*
- Pranks, practical jokes, use of novelties, etc., that threaten the safety or well-being of self or others, or that create a perception thereof.

Liberty Mountain Code of Conduct

- Be courteous and polite to other guests and employees at all time.
- Ski/board in a safe, responsible manner.
- Don't ski/board fast or in a reckless manner.
- Observe all posted signs.
- Do not use foul or offensive language, comments, or gestures.
- Do not throw snowballs or other items at any time or place, including from lifts or in the lift lines.
- Understand and abide by the "Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code" at all times.

Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code

1. Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead or downhill of you have right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
5. Always use devices to prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the ability to load and unload safely. Do not jump from the lift. In the event of a prolonged stoppage, the Ski Patrol will evacuate you.
8. Do not go down trails that are too difficult for your ability.
9. If you have a collision resulting in injury to another person, you must stay with that person until Ski Patrol arrives.

SKI CLUB PARTICIPANT'S PERMISSION FORM AND WAIVER AGREEMENT

**** IMPORANT – YOU MUST READ, SIGN, AND TURN IN AFTER REGISTERING ****

I, the undersigned, as the parent or legal guardian of the participant named herein, give permission for my child to participate fully in the North Bethesda Middle School ("NBMS") Parent Teacher Organization, Inc. ("NBMS PTO")'s Ski Club activities, and to travel by chartered bus from NBMS, Bethesda, MD, to Liberty Mountain Resort, Carroll Valley, PA, and back to NBMS, on the following dates: January 3, January 10, January 24, January 31, February 21, and (if needed) March 7, 2014, and any other make-up dates, if scheduled by the NBMS PTO.

I, the undersigned, fully understand and agree to the following:

Operations and Rules

- Ski Club buses depart NBMS promptly after school dismissal, no later than 3:00 PM. Parents are solely responsible for transportation from NBMS should their child miss the afternoon bus departure. Participants will return by bus to NBMS at approximately 11:15 PM. Parents are solely responsible for being at NBMS before the buses arrive back from Liberty, and transporting the child home after Ski Club. Participants or parents who are late for any announced bus loading, departure, or arrival time are subject to the loss of Ski Club privileges with no refund.
- Any participant who was transported up to Liberty Mountain by Ski Club bus, but has made other arrangements for transportation back to NBMS or home must provide his or her bus chaperone with a signed and dated note from the parent indicating permission not to ride the bus back to Bethesda.
- **All Ski Club trips are made on a "weather-permitting" basis, and only on dates where NBMS is in session for the entire day of school.** A decision may be made by the NBMS PTO to cancel any scheduled trip due to weather conditions or other unforeseen adverse circumstances. Notice of trip cancellation will be posted on the NBMS PTO website, through the NBMS PTSA listserv, and to e-mails provided by parents.
- Ski Club participants are expected to adhere to all MCPS policies for student behavior as described in the NBMS Student Handbook and other MCPS publications. Ski Club participants are expected to adhere also to the NBMS Ski Club Behavioral Expectations, Liberty Mountain Code of Conduct, and Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code. All Ski Club participants must wear a snow sports helmet while on the mountain. **Failure to comply with these policies, expectations, and codes may result in the loss of privileges, from one night up to and including expulsion from the Ski Club, without refund.** Additionally, participants may be referred to NBMS administrators for additional adjudication per MCPS guidelines.
- **The NBMS PTO Ski Club registration fee covers the cost of bus transportation and club administration only.** All other expenses, including but not limited to the Night Club Card (lift tickets, lessons, and/or rentals), optional fees, helmet, winter clothing, food and drinks, locker rentals, and, if needed, medical care and/or emergency transportation, are the sole responsibility of the parent and participant.
- The NBMS PTO Ski Club and its volunteer Chaperones do not take responsibility for the decisions made by participants, including but not limited to their choice of activities while at Liberty Mountain, choice of rental equipment (skis or snowboard, regardless of what they signed up for initially), choice of trails or terrain, attendance at lessons, and/or choice of food and drinks. **The NBMS PTO Ski Club and its volunteer Chaperones does not monitor, supervise, or take any responsibility or liability for participant activity or choices while at Liberty Mountain. Parents and participants are solely responsible for this.**
- Participants are expected to manage their time, money, equipment, and personal belongings themselves. Each participant is personally responsible for securing their belongings and purchasing food, drinks, and other incidentals. While Chaperones are numerous (about 1 per 12-15 participants) and available as much as possible, and Liberty Mountain personnel are also numerous and available as much as possible,

each participant is considered “on their own” while at Liberty Mountain, particularly while skiing or boarding on the mountain. **All participants are highly encouraged not to ski alone at any time.**

- **The NBMS PTO Ski Club registration fee is not tax deductible, and is non-refundable regardless of reason.** The optional Night Club Card protection plan offered by Liberty Mountain does not cover this fee.

Health, Safety, and Property Damage or Loss

- The sports of skiing and snowboarding (collectively “recreational snow sports”), which includes the use of snow sports equipment, mechanized chair and other lifts, are **DANGEROUS ACTIVITIES WITH INHERENT AND OTHER RISKS THAT COULD LEAD TO PERMANENT CATASTROPHIC INJURY OR DEATH. INJURIES ARE A COMMON AND ORDINARY OCCURRENCE OF RECREATIONAL SNOW SPORTS,** and therefore I freely and voluntarily assume for myself and/or the minor I am representing all of the risks involved.
- A snow sports helmet must be used at all times while skiing or boarding. While such use may help reduce the risk of some types of injuries, **SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH STILL CAN RESULT** from both low-energy and high-energy impacts, and therefore I freely and voluntarily assume for myself and/or the minor I am representing all of the risks involved.
